

## A Profile of Kagoshima

## Nature

Kagoshima Prefecture is on the southwestern tip of the Japanese isles with a total land area of 9,187km². It's 272km laterally, 600km longitudinally and the average annual temperature in Kagoshima City is 18.8°C. The Kirishima Volcanic Belt elongates down to the Tokara Archipelago and its volcanoes, Sakurajima in particular, are still very much active with the result of having multiple hot springs spewing all over the region. The world's largest calderas, "Ata" and Aira", make up what is Kagoshima Bay or "Kinko Bay" right in the very center of the Prefecture and volcanic ejecta, in the form of shirasu and welded tuff, can be found in the soil of roughly half the entire Prefecture.

## History and Culture

Kagoshima is a land that has welcomed many cultures of the world which found their way to its shores on the Black Current and the seasonal winds. Between the 7th and 9th Centuries, the boats of the Japanese envoys to Tang Dynasty China departed from and returned to Bonotsu, and it was also here that the Tang High Priest Jianzhen landed. Firearms from Portugal arrived at Tanegashima, and the first Christian missionary in Japan, Francis Xavier, landed in 1549 in Kagoshima (in Yamagawa). Satsuma ware, or Satsuma-yaki, was begun here by Korean potters, whom Shimazu Yoshihiro, the lord of the Satsuma Domain, had brought back with him from the continent in 1598. The Satsuma Domain, which unified and stabilized this region in the 16th Century, also independently carried out foreign diplomacy and trade, and was instrumental in the development of modern Japan following the Meiji Restoration.

## Industry


This Prefecture is ranked No. 1 in the country for the number of specialized agriculturists. It's also No. 1 in the number of heads of hog, broiler chickens and egg laying chickens and No. 2 in the number of heads of beef cows and tea production. In marine products, the region is No. 1 in Japan for bonito catches and is prominent in deep-sea fishing, such as for tuna, as well as coastal fishing. Using this bounty from the land and seas, much is processed into various commercial products such as dried bonito shavings, brown sugar and distilled spirits. Also a major industry is tourism, which is solidly based on the region's wondrous and plentiful natural environment, its historical treasures and wealth of valuable hot-springs.

### People

Kagoshima Prefecture is the meeting place between Japanese culture on its southward journey, and the cultures of the south that flowed up along the sea-route comprised by the many southern islands. A new culture can be seen in the fusion of these two elements. Due to the isolating topography hampered by the northern Kyushu Highlands, there is the distinctive culture and language established under the 700 year reign of the Shimazu Clan, while added to this is the bright and open temperament from the ocean-encircled southern clime.

## Geography

Humans appeared some 2 million years ago when glaciers covered the earth and volcanoes were vehemently active. At that time, Kagoshima's Ata and Aira calderas saw much activity and then sank in the ocean waters to form Kinko Bay. Although there are many volcanoes in Kyushu, Kagoshima Prefecture has 7 active volcanoes such as the symbolic Sakurajima, Mt. Kirishima made up of several volcanoes, the "Satsuma Fuji" Mt. Kaimon and several volcanic isles strewn in the southern sea.



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
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# Learning the structure of volcanos



#### Sakurajima is one of the world's most active volcanos map 1

Known as the symbol of Kagoshima, Sakurajima is a volcanic island some 4 kilometers in the ocean off Kogoshima City, the urban center of southern Kyushu. Standing proud at 1,117m, the mount appeared about 25,000 years ago on the southern marginal rim of the Aira caldera. Consisting of two strato volcanoes of Mt. Kitadake and Mt. Minamidake, it has had numerous eruptions throughout history. As recently as 1914, it covered 400 meters of the channel coastline and made a land bridge to Osumi Peninsula spewing 10 billion tons of molten rock, such amount hardly seen anywhere else in the world. There is an observation deck halfway up the mountain that gives visitors a great view of the summit and enables them to get a feel of this active volcano, which still erupts time and again. This locale is great for not only experiencing the workings of our earth and the great outdoors but also for learning about how people live there.

#### 2 Arimura Observation Deck



Located on the south side of Sakurajima before the Cape Arimurazaki, it sits on the small hill that was created by lava during the Great Eruption of 1946. It offers a striking view of the Sakurajima in the forefront as well as a close up look at its still active Mt. Minamidake.

#### Enjoy "Kaimondake" Hiking and learn how volcanoes form

Because the mount has a strato basalt summit topped with an andesite lava dome, which, when viewed from afar, looks like they are perfectly congruous, it is dubbed the "Satsuma Fuji". Its seismic activity began some 4,000 years ago and the last lava dome was formed in the 9th Century. All year long, climbers go up its 924m elevation taking them 2 to 3 hours to reach the summit by the spiral hiking trail. The top boasts a 360° panoramic view of the Kirishima Mountain Chain as well as the islands in the South China Sea.

#### "Hot Springs"...a blessing from the volcano

Kagoshima Prefecture, which is blessed with volcanic geothermal sources, is ranked No. 2 in the number of hot springs and third in total ground-water discharge making it Hot Spring Heaven. Everywhere in the prefecture, you'll find hot springs. Ibusuki, where hot springs spew onto a beach, is world renown as a natural sand hot spring where visitors cover themselves with hot sand.


## Encompassed by sheer nature

Located some 60km due south of the Cape Sata on the southern tip of the Kyushu continental plate, Yakushima is reputed as having been created over ten and several million years ago by a huge chunk of granite thrusting upwards from the earth's crust. The seacoast is subtropical but the summit is nearly subarctic and having a winter season with snow and ice, giving the area a natural system that is very desirable for witnessing at once all the climates of the Japan Archipelago. Its vertical distribution of climates, lush primeval forest and ancient Yakusugi trees are world renown. In 1993, it received Japan's very first World Natural Heritage site designation.

Inaugurated as the lord of the Satsuma Domain in 1851, Shimazu Nariakira formed his policies of enriching the country, strengthening the military, increasing production, and reforming business, in order to compete with the advancement of the world powers. Thus he established the Shusei Hall, a hub for industrial production that took the lead in modernizing such industries as steelworks, shipbuilding, and textile production. Today, the vestiges of the Shusei Hall are open to the public as a museum.





Since the latter half of the 16th Century, Satsuma has a history of strong rule and

excellence in the literary and military arts. Representative of this spirit is Jigenryu, a martial art hoarded in Satsuma even into the early Showa Period. Jigenryu is infused with the Satsuma spirit, telling us to Improve the body as well as the heart," and that "a katana is something that should not be drawn."
