Disseminating Kyushu's allures to the world! British travel channel Travelxp's international collaboration program, "PADDY AND DAN'S BUCKET LIST – KYUSHU, JAPAN" will be broadcast in over 20 countries

RKB Mainichi Broadcasting Corporation (hereinafter "RKB"; Ryoji Inoue, CEO) announced that it will be airing a program that it is co-producing with Travelxp and Killion Films, "PADDY AND DAN'S BUCKET LIST – KYUSHU, JAPAN," in over 20 countries around the world in cooperation with Kyushu Tourism Promotion Organization (hereinafter "KTPO"; Susumu Ishihara, Chairperson).

The program is navigated by Paddy Doherty and Daniel Coll, who are media stars in Ireland and the UK and will be visiting Japan for the first time. They will try their hand at various challenges throughout the island of Kyushu as they convey the region's allures. Special guests include Asia's No. 1 chef, Gaggan Anand, and Takeshi "Goh" Fukuyama, who leads the food scene in Kyushu, and they will create dishes out of local ingredients in the program. "PADDY AND DAN'S BUCKET LIST – KYUSHU, JAPAN" will be aired in over 20 countries around the world, and it will be promoted at MIPCOM, the international entertainment content market held in Cannes, France. We hope that more people outside of Japan who do not yet know about Kyushu will take interest in this region and be inspired to visit.

♦ Program Content

In this program, Paddy, a TV personality in the UK, and producer Daniel travel to Japan for the first time and try their hand at various challenges. These include paragliding at Aso, bungee jumping at Itsuki Village, experiencing a volcano at majestic Mt. Sakurajima, and Japanese sword-making, as well as one-of-a-kind encounters with the culture of the Hidden Christians of Amakusa and Yokagura (night-long Shinto music and dance ritual). As food is also an important theme throughout the journey, the pair also cover local specialties such as Makurazaki's *katsuobushi* (dried skipjack tuna flakes) and Yame's Japanese green tea, to learn about the traditional gastronomic culture of Kyushu. Furthermore, two world-famous chefs (Gaggan and Goh) come to Kagoshima Prefecture, to use ingredients gathered from all around Kyushu and prepare a meal for the visitors at Shigetomisoh, formerly a secondary residence of the 19th century lord of the region. Paddy and Daniel thus spend a month in Kyushu on their first trip to Japan. Neither speak a word of Japanese; don't miss out on how their journey proceeds!
